The RTM is a non-partisan body. Its 36 members, chosen on the basis of population from nine districts, are elected for two year terms. RTM members vote on appropriations recommended by the Board of Finance and approve ordinances for the Town. Members also serve on one or more committees which review and make recommendations regarding appropriations and ordinances.
